THE BASEBALL LINE-UP HOW IMPORTANT IS IT AND WHO SHOULD LEAD OFF ?

For years, it was thought the best lead off man should be the fastest player with a good OBP (On Base Percentage). The second hitter should be able to move him up a base by bunt or hitting behind the runner. The third batter was usually the best all around hitter. The clean-up man was to be the best power guy. The hitter in the five spot hopefully had some power and ability to knock runs in. The 6 to 9 spots were filled with who was left, best of those hitting sixth and weakest hitting ninth. Many teams still follow the logic behind creating a line up that way.

When googling "How to make a baseball lineup", what popped up led to a discussion about information from [The Book - Playing the Percentages in Baseball](#). *The Book Says: Your three best hitters should bat somewhere in the #1, #2 and #4 slots. Your fourth- and fifth-best hitters should occupy the #3 and #5 slots. The #1 and #2 slot will have players with more walks than those in the #4 and #5 slots. From slot #6 through #9, put the players in descending order of quality.*

The argument being that the #1 and #2 hitters get the most at bats so they should be two of the best three hitters on the team and the #4 hitter leads off the second inning if the team goes out in order in the first. The #3 spot's decrease in importance is apparently based on research that says the three guy comes up the most with two outs and no one on and thus renders too many of his hits meaningless.

These formula line-ups don't take into account how good the hitter is at the hit-and-run or how good he is at going from first to third on a single, but many times the team that scores first can control the game and the first man up in the first inning can get his team off to that all important fast start.

Plenty of food for thought and in this issue we'll look at how teams around the *North Star League* use their lead off hitter and who they use as a lead off hitter.

Lead-off Hitters with a batting average over .300 (10 AB or more as lead-off man) are:

FOUR players have lead off every game for their team in 2006

Veterans Brandon Scanlon for Loretto and Andy Gagnon for Howard Lake along with relative newcomers Kevin Holker of Monticello and Tyler Carlson of St. Michael.



Tyler Carlson is a stereotypical lead-off man. A slap hitter who beats out bunts and infield hits. He sets the table for the Saints power hitters. Tyler is hitting .342 from the lead-off spot and leads all lead-off hitters in runs scored.



Catchers are not usually lead-off hitters, so using Matt Bergstrom at the top of the line-up fits into the category of using a top hitter to start the game. Matt is hitting .429 leading off and shows patience at the plate with good bat control and an excellent ability to hit-and-run in D-C's aggressive style attack.



The A's lead the league in runs scored by their lead-off men. They have employed Kevin Jaunich and his .379 batting average as their main lead-off guy. Kevin has proven to be both one of the better hitters for average with a knack for getting on base in front of the A's middle of the order hitters.



Darin and Tyler Decker have shared duty as the Laker's lead-off hitters, Both are hitting .300 from the number one hole, but the Lakers are near the bottom of the league in runs scored by lead-off hitters. Improving run production from that spot will probably be necessary if the Lakers are going to move up the standings.



The Huskies are the only team in the Central who's lead-off spot is hitting under .300. (They're at .270) Chris Runke and Jordan Schwarze have shared the spot in 2006 consistently getting one or two hits per game, but have not had a lead-off batter score more than one run in any league game this year.



Ben Geelan has a couple of good hitting and run producing games from the one hole in the line-up. Outside of those two games, Buffalo's has not produced much from that spot.



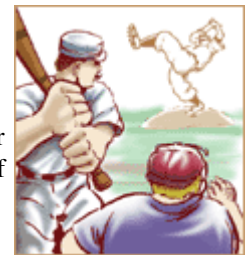
The Orphans take the unconventional approach of using their catcher, Andy Gagnon, as the first man to bat each game. Through the first half of the schedule, Andy is hitting .379 and with his brother Luke hitting second they have proven to be a tough combo to get out at the top of the Orphans's order.



The Polecats have inserted Kevin Holker into the lead off spot for them and he has responded by leading their team in hitting with a .323 batting average for 2006.



The Kings switched to Billy Aho a few games ago to jump start their offense and he has rewarded them with three 2 for 4 games and the top average of .500 among lead off hitters league wide.

The Diamond Devils take the traditional approach and try to use their first two spots in the line-up to set the table so their 3-4-5 hitters can drive them in. Last year, the Diamond Devils used Matt Goodwald as their lead-off man, but when he was unavailable for the first few league games, they moved KC Johnson up from his normal slot as the two-hitter. He hit .320 in his 6 games as lead-off man and Matt has now returned to the lead-off spot with KC returned to his more familiar two hole. The key to how well Maple Plain does offensively often rides on the shoulders of these first two hitters as the middle of the line-up usually can drive runners home if they come to the plate with men on base.



Loretto has the most consistent hitter leading off for them. Brandon Scanlon led the division in hitting in 2005 and has started off 2006 by connecting at a .423 pace. The Larks employ the approach that batting Brandon first gets their best average hitter to the plate more times than anybody else and keeps the pressure on the opposition.



The Mallards have struggled the most, getting the weakest production from their number one hitters. They don't seem to have settled on any one player but they do need to find someone who can get on in front of Sycks and Snyder if they want to score enough to win.



The Villains lineup card usually starts with Jason Juntanen or Shane McLaughlin. They have been knocking out a hit per game at that spot which is about what every part of their line-up has been doing. The Villains need to bunch their hits a little more and get a few more multiple hit games from the top of the order to produce more runs.

The River Bandits initiate their attack with Mike Daugs as their main lead-off hitter. Cole Hanson has been the main number 2 guy, moving up to lead-off when Daugs isn't there. Those two are hitting just under .300, but they have been two of the hottest hitters for Rockford and no one behind them in the order is knocking them in with any consistency.

NEW VENUE FOR STATE TOURNAMENT
